APOVF AUBERGINES

The aubergine is native to India; it seems that it was not known in Europe until about 1500 years ago: in effect, the lack of ancient Greek and Latin names indicates that this plant was introduced in Europe by the Arabs in the early Middle Ages. The first region which has experienced the aubergine in Europe seems to be Andalusia, in southern Spain. In Italy aubergine was cooked starting from 400. The aubergine (*Solanum melongena* L.) is an herbaceous plant, erect, from 30 cm to slightly more than one meter in height. Fruits are large berries, elongated or round in shape, usually black in colour, edible after cooking.
